## POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS: VENOUS ABLATION AND PHLEBECTOMY

**WOUND CARE:** Remove all bandages (ace wrap, gauze wrap, gauze pads, etc.) the next morning.

- A small amount of bright red blood is expected. Do not be alarmed. After the dressings are removed, you can wash off the surrounding skin with soap & water. Many parts of your leg will become black and blue and some parts will get swollen; this is expected after surgery.
- Contact our office with signs of infection: fever, intense redness, draining of pus.
- Do not put ice and do not apply heat to the infected area.

**ACTIVITIES:** Do not make any important decisions, drive or operate any hazardous machinery for 24 hours until full recovery from the anesthesia.

- Do not engage in sports, heavy work or lifting until 1-2 weeks.
- You may return to work within 24-48 hours.
- You may start driving in 24 hours if not taking any narcotics pain medicine.
- It is very important to walk and climb stairs normally, however no prolonged standing. Whenever you are not walking, elevate your legs on another chair.
- Walk one mile daily for 5 days OR 15 minutes every hour for (5) hours for (5) days.

**DIET:** Resume your previous diet if you are not nauseated.

• Do NOT take any sedatives, narcotics, or tranquilizer for 24 hours unless specifically ordered to do so by your surgeon. No alcoholic beverages for 24 hours.

**PAIN:** A small amount of discomfort is common after vein surgery. Take extra strength Tylenol 1,000mg every 6 hours AS NEEDED for pain. Call the office for any severe pain.

Any prescriptions given to you must be used as directed by the doctor.
